Continuous Improvement Teams are rotating groups of employees from all project levels, created to continuously and collaboratively find ways to increase our job site safety.

CIT Team #1 created the Safety Assessment Walk (SAW)

- SAWs give the entire crew the ability to assess and address potential safety hazards proactively, providing everybody in the crew the ability to help create a safer working environment.
- Purpose: improved assessments processes that clearly define expectations, encourage involvement, and build on positive reinforcement to inspire ownership in our safety culture throughout the entire organization.
- They Involve employees at all levels on a project to ensure ownership for the entire crew.
- Not an Inspection.
- Not an Audit.

SAWs allow you to:

- Listen to the concerns of team members.
- Gain further understanding of jobs and tasks, including both **conditions** and **behaviors**.
- Identify existing and potential hazards, determine and identify underlying causes, and recommend corrective actions.
- Leverage positive recognition.
- Share information collected with local project teams for learning purposes.

The team defined the number of SAWs for all levels and frequency.

- SAW numbers are verified and reviewed weekly for completion.

Safety Assessments

- Increase employee awareness and understanding
- Can identify trends which can eliminate injuries and make our workplace safer.
- Real-time assessments can prevent events from occurring in that moment.
